Dr. David Gardner received his B.S. degree from Syracuse University and M.S. degree (Biochemistry) from the University of Rochester. He graduated from the University of Rochester with an M.D. with Honors and Distinction in Research. He completed his internship and residency in Internal Medicine at the Massachusetts General Hospital (Boston) and his endocrinology fellowship in the Combined Endocrinology Training Program of the National Institutes of Health.

He joined the faculty at UCSF as Adjunct Instructor of Medicine in 1979. He is currently Professor of Medicine in Residence and Interim Co-Chief of the Division of Endocrinology, Metabolism and Osteoporosis in the Department of Medicine.

His research interests focus on the laboratory investigation of the hormonal regulation of growth and hypertrophy in the cardiovascular system with a particular emphasis on the natriuretic peptide system. He is a past recipient of a Clinical Investigator Award from the NIH, an Established Investigator Award from the American Heart Association and the Young Scholar Award from the American Society of Hypertension. He is a member of the American Society of Clinical Investigation and the Association of American Physicians, and a Fellow of the High Blood Pressure Council of the American Heart Association. He has served as a member and Chair of the Cardiovascular and Renal Study Section at the NIH. He has served as the Supplements Editor of the American Journal of Medicine and he currently serves as editor of the Lange-McGraw Hill textbook "Basic and Clinical Endocrinology".

He has served as a member of the Committee on Academic Personnel and as a member and Chair of the Committee on Academic Planning and Budget for the UCSF Academic Senate.
