### School of Dentistry

The School of Dentistry uses the auditorium for two continuing education courses (one or two days each) during each year. Faculty in the departments/divisions that work at Laurel Heights use the existing small seminar rooms on a regular basis.

### School of Medicine

Two of the School of Medicine's five pathways may be primarily housed at Laurel Heights and thus would likely conduct one or more of their required core courses there. The estimated space needs follow:

Health and Society: 2-5 courses meeting daily over two-week or 4-week periods, 1-2 small group rooms per course.

Clinical Scholars: An intense 30 day series of day-long seminars take place at Laurel Heights in September. A conference room has been used as a seminar room for the past two years and similar adequate seminar space will continue to be available. Enrollment is 25-28.

MS in Global Health: The course directors are just organizing the schedule for the coming year but the following fall and winter tentative schedule has been developed:
