Re: Revised CCGA Handbook

Dear Graduate Council Chairs:

Please find attached the newly updated CCGA Handbook that will be in effect starting September 1, 2016. The most substantive revision to the Handbook is expanded guidance for proposers of Self-Supporting Graduate Professional Degree Programs (SSGPDPs), found in Appendix K. Program proposals should now include the cost analysis that is submitted to Budget and Capital Resources and UCOP, and provide sufficient detail to address concerns that have arisen in recent SSGPDP reviews, as enumerated in Appendix K. CCGA understands that the cost analysis is of a provisional nature.

This expanded guidance is intended to assist proposers in addressing concerns commonly raised by reviewers and the committee in evaluating SSGPDPs for approval within the context of UC's standard criteria for graduate programs. Local Graduate Councils are asked to pay particular attention that the expanded guidelines are followed by proposers. It is hoped that this will reduce the number of iterations between CCGA and program proposers, and shorten time for the review.
