The School of Nursing has proposed a new program for the Masters of Science in Healthcare Administration and Interprofessional Leadership (MS HAIL) to meet the demands of the changing health care environment, increase the number of trained healthcare leaders to effect essential change in the healthcare system.

This graduate degree program is designed to accommodate the schedules and learning needs of working professionals through a blended online/on-campus blended design. In addition to reaching larger numbers of qualified students, the blended on-campus/online model for advanced study can be accomplished in four quarters while students continue to live and work in their home environment.

2 Item 2

The MS HAIL program is a response to local, national and international calls for graduate healthcare education to move beyond discipline-based silos. The program is developed in collaboration with the UCSF Center for Health Professions (CHP) and aligns with the UCSF Chancellor's support for online and interprofessional health education. The new program also complements the work of the Center for Innovation in Interprofessional Education and the Clinical and Translational Science Institute (CTSI), all located at UCSF, easing access, support and cooperation among programs.
