Nominate a Distinguished UCSF Faculty Member

The Academic Senate Committee on Research invites nominations for the 2025-2026 Faculty Research Lectures. Nominate a UCSF faculty member who has made exceptional contributions to their field. The deadline for submissions is June 2, 2025. Nomination packets should be submitted via the Senate Service Portal: <u>senateserviceportal.ucsf.edu</u>.

This prestigious award honors outstanding scientific achievements in three categories:

- Basic Science
- Clinical Science
- Social, Behavioral, and Health Policy Sciences

The award is based on the nominee's entire career.

How to Nominate

- Nominators should indicate the best-fitting category for the nominee's research on the application's cover page.
- Translational researchers may be nominated in either Basic Science or Clinical Science, depending on their research focus.
- Clinical researchers addressing social and behavioral issues may be nominated in Clinical Science or Social, Behavioral, and Health Policy Sciences, depending on the focus of their work.

Advancing PRIDE Values

How to Submit

Submit a single PDF via the Senate Service Portal containing:

- Cover page with the nominee's name, degree(s), title, department(s), school affiliation(s), and the category (Basic Science, Clinical Science, or Social, Behavioral, and Health Policy Sciences).
- One-page letter summarizing the nominee's scientific career achievements (this letter does not count as one of the required letters of support).
- **Two letters of support** from UCSF faculty members (one can be from the nominator).
- Current curriculum vitae (CV) of the nominee.

Re-Nominations

Nominees from previous years may be re-nominated by submitting the original packet, along with a statement confirming the letters of support remain valid. It's recommended to update the nomination packet with a current CV and letters of support if possible.

Additional Requirements

Nominators (or one of the letter writers) must be available to meet with the Committee on Research for a **5-minute discussion** during their meeting on **Monday, June 16, 2025**, from **3-5 pm via Zoom**.

If the nominee is selected, their nomination materials (including letters) may be used to promote the event.
