4. Accomplishments/Activities

Committee objectives	During the fall quarter, we oriented new committee members and discussed the objective from the previous year to increase the visibility of the committee among school and campus wide global health faculty groups and committees.	We reviewed the definition of 'global health' with the intention of being more inclusive of people and programs at the SON working on these issues.
Establishment of a global health research office at the Institute of Global Health Sciences (IGHS)	The committee facilitated staff from IGHS to gather data about from SON faculty about their needs regarding international research.	IGHS created a report that described faculty needs when conducting international research.
Global Health Policy and Practice Minor support	We reviewed the global health minor course list and discussed best practices for these offerings and communicating programs to students. This includes the new requirements following the merging of the Global Health Minor and the Health Policy minor.	Committee agreed with current practices and members agreed to collaborate to improve communication to their departments.
	Discussed how to synergize GHPPM with the HIV minor given that there is overlap in the students interested in these two minors	The committee decided that students can be advised to merge the minors if certain requirements were met. The coordinators of these minors can communicate this to interested students.
Global Nursing Forum (GNF) support	The student members of the committee during this year were also the leaders of the student organization in the nursing school focused on global health. They brought their group's priorities to the meetings to discuss.	Committee members provided feedback and brainstormed about how students can engage in global health during their time at the SON. The committee also worked to support the GNF's annual event in the spring quarter.
Strategic planning	Following the sunseting of the Center for Global Health in Dec 2018, the committee discussed how to reorient the activities without a centralized global health program at the SON. We reviewed the bylaws and determined where there were opportunities to expand the committee's activities.	We determined the best approach would be for our committee members to participate in the school wide strategic planning process and align the committee's objectives with those areas prioritized at a school level. This process is ongoing.

5. Issues for 2019-2020

In the recent past, the GHC has served to support the work of the SON Center for Global Health. The SON Center for Global Health was sunsetted in January 2019. Future work for the GHC will be to reorient to supporting faculty, students and programs throughout the school as an independent faculty committee.
