## **COVID-19 Updates for Medical Education**

## **Curriculum Update:**

- 1. All UCSF School of Medicine classes and educational activities will continueunder new strategies and students are expected to fully engage with the curriculum.
- 2. All classroom and lab-based activities for all phases are essential for educational continuity but do not need to be delivered in person. As such, we will shift to a standard of Virtual ('Remote') learning strategies effective March 16, 2020. This includes all F1 blocks and elements, including ARCH week, CIC and CMC. Coursework strategies will be adapted to fit this format. As with our current curriculum, some of the activities will require that you participate at the same time as your classmates while participation in other activities be able to be completed asynchronously. We will be providing information on how this will happen via the weekly curriculum email updates and directly through your iROCKET/llios calendar updates.
- 3. At this time, all high stakes examinations are essential and will be delivered on campus because of the need for exam security. This includes the REGN exam scheduled for 3/13/20. We are taking steps to decrease the number of people in the exam rooms at the same time so that social distancing is appropriate. Examinations involving standardized patients will **not** be held.
- 4. F2 and Career Launch clinical activities are essential for educational continuityand competency development and will continue as we have previously described. Students will not be assigned to provide direct care for patients with or suspected of having COVID-19 but will support their team in the care of those patients outside of the patient's room and will be assigned to provide direct care for other patients.
- 5. Involvement by first year students in the clinical environment is considered nonessential during the COVID-19 epidemic and thus will be stopped. First year students may not shadow in the clinical environment during this time of added workload for our faculty and employed professionals and staff. We will make sure that you have an opportunity for shadowing at a later date.

## **Events Update:**

- 1. Match Day: Because we cannot ensure social distancing, Match Day will be held virtually; we hope to have a formal celebration of your successes sometime in early May. We realize how disappointing this will be for all of you and your loved ones, as it is for us. Please watch for communications from DQ for further information. Of note, the SOAP process will proceed in person in S-221.
- Admitted Students Weekend: Similarly, Admitted Students Weekend will not be held in person this year. We are delighted that our students have agreed to work with Dean Wofsy and Hallen Chung to explore alternate ways to welcome our admitted students virtually.
- 3. Graduation: At this time, we are hoping that the status of the epidemic will allow us to hold graduation as scheduled. We will make a final decision about graduation one month in advance of the event. Students, we encourage you to have your guests wait to make travel arrangements until after April 18—we will be back in touch with you.
