

What is the Academic Senate?

Established by the <u>University of California</u> in 1878 to give faculty shared governance of academic mission at each campus.



UCSF Academic Senate is one of 10 campus divisions.

Volunteers serve on:

- 18 standing committees
- 4 faculty councils (each school)
- Special Committees

What is the Academic Senate?

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- Our UCSF faculty government* is comprised of standing committees, faculty councils, special task forces, etc.
- Represents the voice of faculty at UCSF* on academic, research, and health policy and organizational and operational impact.
- Recognized as university service by leadership and Committee on Academic Personnel (CAP)
- Open to all UCSF faculty series* that directly impacts policy and initiatives at UCSF and systemwide



^{*}All faculty series are highly encouraged to vote on Senate matters and serve on committees.

What do volunteers do?

Committee members work with faculty and leaders across campus on issues and activities that impact faculty life and academic affairs.

These are just a few examples:

- Faculty Time-Use Study | A special task force identified trends and disparities in how faculty spend their uncompensated time after securing a Senate Chancellor's Fund award. (<u>Learn More</u>)
- Faculty Writing Support Project | The Committee on Library & Scholarly Communications conducted a campuswide writing needs assessment and feasibility study for a central writing center at UCSF. (Learn More)
- UC Systemwide Sustainability Memorial | Your UCSF Senate led a systemwide Memorial to the Regents to shape the UC's sustainability policy and investments.
- Reviewing Senate award nominations | Various committees review nominations for awards, including Faculty Research Lectureships, Clinical Excellence Awards, and more.
- Reviewing promotion packets | Committees on Advancement and Promotion (CAP Blue and CAP Gold)
 advise the Chancellor on appointments, promotions, merit advancements, changes in series, appraisals,
 terminations, and personnel action appeals.





Impact Story: Faculty Time Use Study

"We launched a study with two primary goals:

- to document, evaluate, and quantify faculty time spent across a range of university-related activities; and
- to identify systematic disparities in the distribution of invisible work among UCSF faculty.



A Look At Representation: Service Data by School


The UCSF Academic Senate is:

- MEDICINE (~63% of 177) 110
- NURSING (~14% of 177) 25
- DENTISTRY (~11% of 177) 19
- PHARMACY (~11% of 177) 19

Campus is:

- MEDICINE (~91% of 4235) 3874
- NURSING (~4% of 4235) 153
- DENTISTRY (~3% of 4235) 85
- PHARMACY (~2% of 4235) 85


A Look At Representation: Service Data by School

Medicine	3%




A Look At Representation: Service Data by Series





A Look At Representation: Service Data by Rank






